The GP-TCM **Final Conference:** Conference of the GP-TCM Consortium took place on the historic premises of a medieval abbey - Rolduc - in Kerkrade, the Netherlands on  $12^{th} - 13^{th}$  April 2012. The Rolduc Conference (http://www.rolduc.com/) is one of the well-known Dutch conference venues and attracted more than 70 beneficiary and non-beneficiary partners as well as key stakeholders. Among the special guests were Dr. Xiaopin Wang (王笑频 Director-General, Department of International Cooperation, State Administration of Traditional Chinese Medicine (SATCM) and Dr. Jijun Xing (邢继俊 Deputy Director, China Science & Technology Exchange Center of Ministry of Science & Technology (MOST)) and Prof. Geoffrey Burnstock, FRS (Autonomic Neuroscience Centre, University College Medical School, UK).

The meeting was a closed-door event, where WP-focused presentations and interactive discussion sessions took place. There were welcome speeches and introductions from Dr. Xiaopin Wang and Dr. Jijun Xing, who restated the support from the Chinese government to the FP7 GP-TCM Consortium and introduced their views on TCM research programmes within and outside China. Furthermore, other detailed discussion sessions were held allowing the participants to focus on a number of key issues including future funding opportunities and the establishment of the GP-TCM Research Association (http://www.gp-tcm.org/association/). Prof. Jan van der Greef (Gorlaeus Laboratories, University of Leiden) gave an illuminating presentation on the importance of a holistic approach using systems biology to study Chinese medicine. The most important news was that he and his team (SU BioMedicine BV, TNO) in close collaboration with Chinese counterparts have been able for the first time to register a traditional Chinese medicine "Diao Xin Xue Kang capsules" 地奥心血康胶囊 (see Item 3 of Recommended Readings on p. 6) with the Dutch registration authorities and thus opening the way into Europe!



Dr. Shwu-Huey Liu of PhytoCeutica Inc. gave a comprehensive overview on R&D and clinical trial of PHY906 as an adjuvant to chemotherapy in the USA (see Item 3 of Members' News on p. 5).



Subsequent lectures by invited speakers (in alphabetical order, Prof. Xiaodong Cheng, Prof. Wei Ding, Prof. Pierre Duez, Dr. Tai-Ping Fan, Prof. Gerhard Franz, Prof. Peter Hylands, Dr. Werner Knöss, Prof. Nicola Robinson, Dr. Jandirk Sendker, Prof. Monique

Simmonds, Prof. Claudia Witt, and Dr. Youping Zhu) focused on the state-of-the-art in their respective fields.

Representing the Dutch Society against Quackery, Prof. Marinus Vermeulen gave a presentation "How did the concept of meridians survive?" He reviewed the development of Western medicine, in which major paradigm shifts occurred, and asked when such changes happened in TCM. In response, Prof. Peter Hylands presented "Can the new technologies help explain and understand TCM?" The consensus was the need for evidence-based medicines. The GP-TCM network is exactly focused on this and particularly on defining the good practices to generate reliable and reproducible data for registration of Chinese herbal products.

Besides the invited speakers, a series of short lectures and posters around the theme of traditional medicine were presented showing that a new generation of scientists is involved in some exciting aspects of traditional medicine research.

Apart from all the science, there were ample opportunities for the 130-plus participants to socialise during the reception in the historic Town Hall of Leiden, where they were warmly greeted by the Mayor of Leiden, drs. Henri Lenferink, and Dean of Faculty of Science, Leiden University, Prof. dr. Sjoerd Verduyn

**3.** Chinese Medicine Goes Under the Microscope: Professor Yung-Chi Cheng, Co-Chair of the FP7 GP-TCM Consortium, tells *Wall Street Journal* his story of research and development of PHY906 from a traditional formula, Huang Qin Tang 黄芩汤.

Scientists studying a four-herb combination discovered some 1,800 years ago by Chinese herbalists have found that the substance enhances the effectiveness of chemotherapy in patients with colon cancer. The mixture, known in China as huang qin tang, has been shown in early trials to be effective at reducing some side effects of chemotherapy, including diarrhea, nausea and vomiting. The herbs

also seem to bolster colon-cancer treatment: Tests on animals with tumors have shown that administering the herbs along with chemotherapy drugs restored intestinal cells faster than when chemo was used alone.

PHY906 is a rare example of a plant-based product used in traditional folk medicine that could potentially jump the hurdle into mainstream American therapy. A scientific team led by Yung-Chi Cheng, an oncology researcher at Yale University, and funded in part by the National Cancer Institute, is planning to begin Phase II clinical trials to study PHY906's effectiveness in people with colon cancer.

"What Dr. Cheng is doing is keeping [the herbal combination] as a complex entity and using that as an agent," says Josephine Briggs, head of the federal National Center for Complementary and Alternative Medicine, which is helping fund some of the PHY906 research. "It's polypharmacy," or the equivalent of several drugs being administered at once.

4. The 8th Bencao Reading Club was held in mid-January 2012 in Hong Kong: Bencao Reading Club was founded in Feb. 2011 in Hong Kong Baptist University (HKBU), aiming to share experiences in reading Compendium of Materia Medica (Bencao) and stories behind words in the ancient book. Starting from only a few members, the club has held activities in Hong Kong, Zhuhai, Zhongshan and Chengdu and its membership has grown constantly to be more than 50 as it stands (see photo). Professor Zhongzheng Zhao (nonbeneficiary member of WP1, the FP7 GP-TCM Project) made a speech entitled Innovation should be built on the source of Bencao. He illustrated the importance of Chinese material medica classics such as Bencao by introducing how Professor TU Youyou's Lasker Medical Research Awards winning discovery of artemisinin was enlightened by the records of the ancient book. He also shared his overseas experiences with students and young researchers. A number of other senior scientists also attended the 8<sup>th</sup> Bencao Reading Club.
